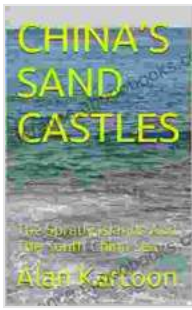

Geopolitical Importance

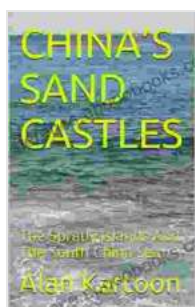

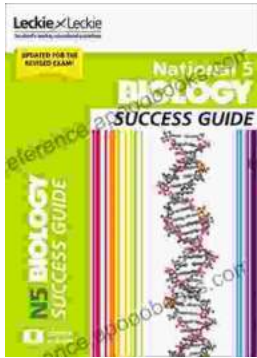

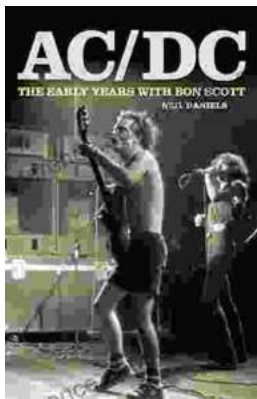
